Most counties in Arizona will have a Technology Integration Specialist (TIS), part of the Statewide Instructional Technology Project to serve that counties technology integration needs. The TIS for Coconino and northern Mohave counties is based out of the Superintendent for Schools office in Flagstaff, AZ. The geographical area covered by the TIS is that of Coconino County and parts of southern and northern Mohave County. Provision of services is funded from a Title IID grant and is subject to grant renewal on an annual basis.
